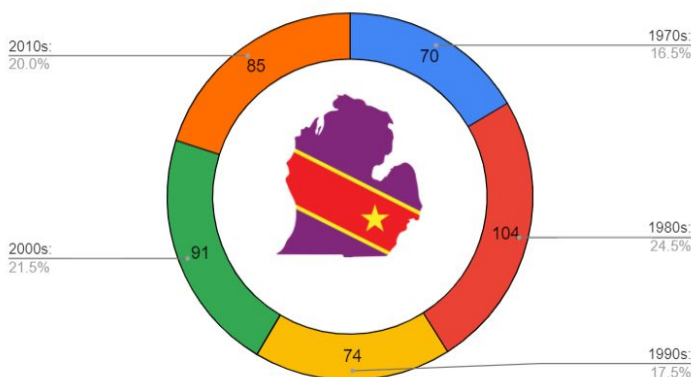

Even though the experience was only a few hours, time really flew by and it only seemed like 20 minutes.



Volleyball Blast

All of the brothers get to come together, play some volleyball, and the funds go directly to Fleece and Thank you, our most recent philanthropy partner. Although my team didn't win the tournament (sadly), we all still had a great time. Every team was dressed up in goofy uniforms and had their own chants they would do whenever they scored a point. I definitely made some memories I will cherish forever that day, and all while competing for a good cause. SigEp raised \$250 for F&TY during Volleyball Blast.



Top Balanced Man Scholarship Renamed

The chapter's Balanced Man Scholarship program continues to progress each school year and the top award given at each year's BMS is now named the "Randall and Diana Brooks Balanced Man Scholarship" in honor of the program's largest ever contributors, **Randy Brooks '81 and Diana Brooks**. Over the last 3 years they have donated a total of \$10,000, and increased their annual donation to \$4,000 this year. Randy and Diana, we cannot thank you enough for your continued support!

Another big step towards ensuring the longevity of the annual effort was the establishment of the "MI Theta BMS Endowment" Fund at HQ early in 2021. This dedicated fund was able to start at \$25,000 and will currently generate nearly \$1,000 each year for the scholarship. The goal is to grow this fund to \$75,000 in the next 5 years by achieving 83 individual \$10/month donations. At the moment, we are 25% of the way to our individual donor goal! Our VPs of Recruitments have seen the benefit of these efforts first hand and our current VPR recounts his experiences below.

Joe Mitrzyk '22 - The BMS campaign this year proved to be challenging, but also rewarding. Following last year's BMS, we knew that we needed to focus more on it this time. This year, \$2450 was given out in scholarships for the top 10 winners. Of those 10 winners, we had 3 join this semester. We received 58 applicants and interviewed 40 of them. Unlike last year, we were also able to host a banquet for the with Josh Andree as the keynote speaker. There was also a BBQ held for all of the applicants prior to the banquet.

Fall 2021 Recruitment

Joe Mitrzyk '22 Recruitment this year was a lot more intense than the few previous ones due to covid. For the spring of 2021, recruitment was solely done over zoom for the school rules restricted in-person events. We were not even allowed to have a booth which proved very challenging. Then by the time fall recruitment rolled around, the school had relaxed its rules which allowed for a more normal, and exciting, recruitment. The incoming fall class for 2021 was the largest that the school has seen in a long time so naturally that provided high hopes for a large class. Having bidded 8 guys by the end of the first week and 19 total by the end of the second, that was proving to be the case.



Despite coming slightly under our goal, the chapter still did an amazing job. To put it into perspective, we recruited more members than all of the other fraternities combined, as well as one fourth of all Greek life this semester. The fall 2021 rush class consists of 11 new guys which includes 5 athletes. This was possible because this semester athletes are now able to join in their first semester. Some of the notable events that we held were WhirlyBall, batting cages, glow golf, and a volleyball tournament. There were events planned with all sororities as well as a mixer with the O'rohs. As mentioned before, recruitment had been harmed by covid and so had the recruitment spirit. This semester we were able to inspire the brothers and bring the passion back into recruitment, which was my ultimate goal as VPR

Advocating for Mental Health

Sound Mind, Sound Body; In addition to Virtue, Diligence, and Brotherly Love, it's what we live by within the Balanced Man Program as SigEps. Both have elements of them that are fairly easy to spot, Sound Body via how much someone frequents the gym, and Sound Mind perhaps how high someone's GPA may be. Likewise, both also have traits that are not as easily seen and therefore can too easily go overlooked. For Sound Body it may be what that brother who goes to the gym frequently does behind the scenes with his nutrition, and Sound Mind the brother who meditates in private before bed to calm nerves from the days activities.

Increasingly in today's world, and particularly in college students, struggles with keeping a Sound Mind and in turn mental health is one of the greatest personal challenges and has become a nationwide conversation for people of all ages. Michigan Theta has been no less affected by this conversation than anyone else, and one of the priorities of the AVC over the next year is to create a stronger support and outreach system for our undergraduates who may experience similar struggles from time to time. If this subject speaks to you, please reach out to get involved and help us envision it. One event the chapter is doing is called the Pieknik Picnic that has emerged in remembrance of brother Nikolas Pieknik. Current president, Josh Pastrana remembers Nik and describes the event's purpose.

Josh Pastrana '23 - One of the things that has been brought to light over the last couple of years is the importance of mental health. During the many struggles of the COVID-19 pandemic, it has become even more important now to bring mental health to the forefront and ensure our brothers are feeling safe, comfortable and in a sound mental state. Sadly, many brothers know the devastating effects of not knowing the signs of poor mental health after brother **Nikolas Pieknik '18** took his own life in the summer of 2018. Over the last two years the undergraduates have held a day of remembrance for Nik and what he meant to so many people. This day of remembrance has evolved into what is now an annual event held by the chapter called the Pieknik Picnic. As we move forward and continue to grow this event, we are working closely with Lawrence Tech to have this be a campus wide event to help bring awareness to mental health and support any students who are struggling and need help from friends and professionals. We intend to keep Nik's memory alive while promoting the importance of sound mental health and giving people avenues to express themselves and receive the help they need to improve. This past year, we shared stories of Nik at the picnic and later at night, we had Chinese lanterns where we wrote out different messages to Nik or anything anyone wanted to get off their chest and released them as a group during the closing ceremony.



JJ Burning Heart

12 Years of Recognition

Last year, after 12 years of fundraising, the JJ Burning Heart award was fully endowed at an amount of \$25,000, which allows us to award the recipient a scholarship equaling the chapter's annual dues. Each year since 2009, the winner's name is inscribed on a plaque. After 13 years, we are finally onto our second plaque that will go on to represent the 2nd generation of the best of our our undergrads. The first generation has been quite the group; 7 of the 12 have been chapter presidents, 2 were selected for the Tragos Quest to Greece, 1 was hired as a Regional Director and went on to work for HQ, 1 achieved SigEp Fellow, and all have served on Eboard. We thank you brothers for your contributions!

2021 - Josh Pastrana '23

Josh started at Lawrence Tech in Fall 2018 dual majoring in Architecture and Interior Design. He quickly became involved in SigEp through the recruitment and programming committees from Fall 2018 and all of 2019. He was then elected to be the Vice President of Programming in 2020 and also served as a Sigma Challenge coordinator. Josh was elected as Chapter President for 2021 where he and his fellow Executive Board focused on supporting chapter moral and mental health during the pandemic and honoring our lost brother, Nikolas Pieknik. Outside of SigEp Josh was VP of IIDA and a member of AIAS. Josh is someone who truly "bleeds SigEp", he wears his heart on his sleeve, and his letters with pride daily.

2009 - Michael Newton '13

The first ever recipient, Michael Newton served as VP of Recruitment, & President. He was also was the first MI Theta brother selected for the Tragos Quest to Greece in 2012.

2010 - Austin Chapman '14

Austin was elected VP of Communications and VP Programming before going on to serve as President in 2012 and 2013. He later was hired by HQ as a Regional Director for the 2014-2015 academic year.

2011 - Michael Paciero '15

Current AVC President, Mike received the JJ at the 40th Anniversary, was elected VP Programming in 2012 & 2013, and became MI first ever Fellow award recipient in 2015.

2012 - Richard Douglas '16

A very active and culturally influential member, Rich was elected President in 2014 and was instrumental in leading the Chapter's Epsilon & Brother Mentor challenges.

2013 - Dean Perkins '17

Dean served as VP recruitment in 2014? and went on to become known for organizing "Dern Talks", Ted Talk-Like presentations that drove Member Development forward.

2014 - Tony Fakhouri '17

Tony served as VP of Member Development during the 2015 school year, President in the following years, and continues to be instrumental to MI Theta as the AVC's VP Comm today



2015 - Travis McCall '18

Travis led the way with Volleyball Blast in 2015 and redefined the event as an outdoor tournament. He went on to serve as VP of the RLC in 2016.

2016 - Kienan Kowalski

Kienan was awarded the JJ Award at the 45th Anniversary Formal Celebration in Downtown Detroit in 2016 and was later elected President that same Fall.

2017 - Josh Andree '21

Josh served on executive board three times as VP Recruitment in 2018, Chaplain in 2019, and President in 2020. He also became MI Theta's second brother to attend the Tragos Quest to Greece in 2019.

2018 - Brandon Agents '20

Brandon was elected and served as VP Communication in 2018 & President in 2019 where he represented us as our Conclave delegate and in receiving the 1st Gold Buch Cup

2019 - Nathan Mark '21

Nathan served on the Chapter's Executive Board for three consecutive years as the VP Finance, Programming and Chaplain.

Now More than Ever: Conclave 2021

- All chapter GPA a full point above the all campus average
- Have won greek day the last five consecutive years
- 40% of incoming freshman men applied to the Balanced Man Scholarship
- 15% of members attended Ruck during the virtual program in summer 2020
- First place in most donors for the 2020 Founders Day of Giving while engaging strong support from alumni
- 30% of members participated in SigEp's career coaching program over the pandemic.

Those are just some of the statistics that were announced at the Balanced Man Celebration at Conclave and led to MI Theta's SIXTH CONSECUTIVE Buchanan Cup this past summer in Denver. We now have 10 cups overall meaning 40% of our years as a chapter have resulted in a Buc Cup! MI Theta truly stands on the shoulders of giants and this 6th consecutive cup would not have been possible without all the hard work and dedication from those that have come before, going as far back as before this streak started in the early 2000's. Which, eventually led to the first of this string of wins in 2011. The impact over that time to both individuals and the chapter as a whole is immeasurable and we thank you for believing in and creating something so special.



Fortunate to have been able to gather in person in late July, “Now More Than Ever” was the theme of this year’s Conclave. A message representative of the changing nature of the fraternity and university environments across the country, and how now more than undergrads and alumni must work together in order to push fraternity and MI Theta forward to be a true partner in higher education and ensure the personal, professional, and leadership development of today’s college students. As current VP of Finance **Mo Al-Najjar ‘22** put it, “My favorite moment from Conclave was our celebration with our alumni after winning our second gold Buc Cup. It’s incredible to see the support of our them after all the hard work we all put in”. This year, MI Theta was able to send five undergraduate brothers to the event, all fully

funded, two by choosing to represent us as the Delegate or Alternate, one winning the national NUTS! Scholarship, and two funded by monies from the Direct Fund raised over time by alumni and chapter efforts. Current President, **Josh Pastrana ‘23** was even selected by the Ritual Task Force to perform the ritual on stage during the event’s opening night. An experience that he says, “strengthened the idea that being with brothers is extremely precious”. Current VP Communications **John Bowling ‘22** and VP Recruitment **Joe Mitrzyk ‘22** also attended as well as **Mason Doll ‘23** who only recently joined in the Fall of 2020. Rounding out the MI Thetas in attendance were alumni **Mike Paciero ‘15**, **Austin Chapman ‘14**, and **Sam Moschelli ‘00**.

More Info Coming Early 2022!

It's the moment you've all been waiting for! On October 23rd, 2021 we turned 50 years old as an organization and we did so virtually and apart. But today we are happy to officially release and announce that the AVC and planning committee are moving forward with our plans.

Nearly 2 years ago in February 2020, a group of alumni and undergrads got together at LTU for the initial planning session of the 50th Anniversary Celebration intended to take place in Fall 2021. Several key directives and goals were set and we were getting ready to go. Little did we know that only a few short weeks later the world would be engulfed by the start of a pandemic. In Fall 2020, with difficulty predicting what a year later would look like, and venues not willing to commit to booking dates the AVC made the decision to move the event to Fall 2022 where we would look to celebrate this milestone WITHIN our 50th year rather than at the turn of it. Winter Retreat

We're Back!

Some years there's snow, some years there's not, but MI Theta's Annual Alumni Winter Retreat goes on regardless of the weather conditions. Unfortunately, last year the 2021 Retreat was affected no differently than every other event in the world due to the COVID-19 pandemic starting not too long after our gathering in January 2020. While the Pandemic is not yet fully behind us, we look forward to resuming the event this year while remaining diligent and cautiously optimistic! To commemorate this, an excerpt from the MI Theta History document looks back at this meaningful event from it's beginning days.

A History

Rob Rochon '90 - The Winter Retreat, a weekend undergraduate and alumni event, was first held at the Yankee Springs State Park outside of Hastings, MI in December of 1974 and it was a weekend used to perform the initiation ceremony Fall class at the time. The chapter now performs Epsilon Rite of Passage during the weekend along with supporting ceremonies like the The Hoop of Steel Ceremony that reflects on the accomplishments of mid school year graduating seniors. Winter Retreat gives alumni a chance to interact and get to know the undergraduates as well as have the opportunity to reflect on the meaning of our Ritual. It is the longest running event for MI Theta spanning all five decades of existence.

Various sub-traditions have been created during the Winter Retreat weekend beginning with the Alumni vs Undergrad, football game in 1981, the Broski Award for brothers in the annual football game starting in 1985, the Winter Retreat Poker Tournament (WRPT) raising money for the MI Theta Endowment Funds in 2004, passing of the President's gavel in 2009 and the Winter Retreat Old Goats in 2010 commemorating those who have attended for 25 years.

After the first Winter Retreat in 1974 at Yankee Springs, it would be held at the park two more times in 1975 and 1976 before taking a four-year hiatus. In December of 1981 the brothers of MI Theta returned to the state park and it was held at either the Chief Noonday or Long Lake Campsites until 2009, when the facilities had major maintenance and operational issues and the State ultimately closed them due to budget issues. Between 1981 and 2009 there were three years (1984, 1994 and 2001) where it was not held at Yankee Springs. A scheduling issue and error with a security deposit caused a disruption in 1984 but brother **Matt Orlando '88** was instrumental in bringing us back in 1985. Then in the 1994-95 academic year, LTU switched from trimesters to semesters so Retreat was moved from December to January and such, there was no event in the 1994 calendar year as they were held in December of 1993 and January of 1995. In 2001 and only a few weeks before

Retreat was to be held the State informed the Chapter that the cabins were being used by another group. That year brother **Gary Christoson '88** stepped up and offered his home in Fowlerville, MI for Retreat to be held. The problems with the State and subsequent private company began a few years prior the chapter finally deciding to relocate the event after no heat was available for the entire weekend in 2009. In 2010 and with the help of the then AVC Vice-President, brother **Nick Stremer, Minnesota '07**, Retreat moved to Camp Kidwell in Bloomingdale, MI and continues to be held at that facility. In 2019 over 95 brothers attended Winter Retreat for the annual event. Over the years, the event has changed as the Fraternity world has but the goal to unite the alumni of MI Theta like this once per year will always remain.



Fun Facts

Winter Retreat Food

In 1998, **Kit Tomkow '90** led the charge to upgrade the quality of food at retreat. With support from **Joe Nutting '94** and several undergraduates, Kit prepared a great deal of food the week before. Armed with a spreadsheet spelling out all the items needed and calculations of quantities based on attendance, they assembled a gourmet camping feast that far surpassed anything compared to what had been done at retreat before. The chapter followed the formula developed by Kit at Winter Retreat for several years until retreat moved to Camp Kidwell where the chapter then had access to a commercial kitchen. For the last several years that same charge to upgrade food at Camp Kidwell has been lead by Alumnus **Kevin Bartos '11**.

Presidential Gavel

In 2008, brother **Lee Bunting '08** created a large gavel from soft pine to be passed down from President to President each year at Winter Retreat and symbolically pass the torch of leadership onto the incoming President. Having this ceremony at Winter Retreat allows the new President to receive congratulations from both the undergraduate and alumni brothers in attendance as well as allow them to talk to past Presidents for guidance.

Poker Tournament

In 2004 an impromptu Texas Hold-Em Poker Tournament with brother **Brant Lyall '88** winning, started a new and third sub-tradition at Winter Retreat. Beginning in 2005 the winner of the tournament received a trophy and half of the winnings from the tournament would go to assist in funding the Chapter BMS with the donation being the winner's name.

Renaissance Brothers Welcomed

At the 2002 Winter Retreat two teams of alumni performed the initiation ceremony and brothers **John Anderson, Renaissance '02** and **Rod Frank, Renaissance '02** became the sixth and seventh Renaissance brothers and Chapter Member #363 and #362 respectively.

Old Goats

The 2010s saw another tradition start for MI Theta and it was the fifth sub-tradition of Winter Retreat. In 2010 brother **Brant Lyall '88** became the first brother to attend 25 Winter Retreats and to honor this unprecedented accomplishment it was decided to create "The Old Goats" club and present brother Lyall with a black baseball hat with an embroidered goat head on the front and the year of his accomplishment on the left side. What made this accomplishment even more impressive is that brother Lyall attended all of these retreats consecutively. Brother Lyall has since been followed by brothers **Gary Christoson '88, Sam Iaquinto '86, Tom Andreozzi '92, Jim Taggart '94, Greg Szczesny '88, Rob Rochon '92, Bruce Serafin '89, Kevin Rem '97 & Sam Moschelli '00**.

Carlson (Minn 1937), this project will provide \$5 million in endowment for scholarships and leadership programs to not only benefit the education of Sig Ep undergrads, but to make Sigma Phi Epsilon the undisputed scholarship and leadership champions of the Greek world. Undergrads sign a pledge of \$25 a year for the first four years of their Alumni status. "There has been little opportunity for alumni to make a contribution..." but Carlson continued that the option of paying pledges over a period of time provides the "...opportunity for an individual to do more than he might first consider." 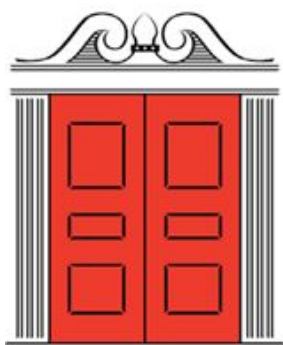
